WELCOME TO KINSMAN FARM

Thank you for your interest in Kinsman Farm CSA. Doug and Valerie both grew up on farms and live on Doug's family homestead. Farming is our way of life.

Implied in sharing the risk of farming with us is the concept that under certain weather conditions some crops may do wonderfully and in other conditions some crops may do poorly.

On Kinsman Farm we practice organic methods of vegetable farming but we are not certified as organic. Our foods are produced with NO chemical herbicides and NO chemical pesticides.



We do not use genetically modified seeds. What we do practice is crop rotation, companion planting, integrated pest management including attracting beneficial insects. We have field filter strips around the planting beds to limit airborne contamination. We plant cover-crops and use compost and straw mulch to build our soil so that it nourishes our plants.

We grow a large diversity of vegetables and often several varieties of the same vegetable throughout the seasons. Early harvests (about the first six weeks) are lighter as mostly greens

are ready in early Spring. However, mid-season ushers in a bountiful harvest. We expect that there will be an average of eight to twelve items per week for each family.

CSA pickups normally begin the third week of May and continue through September, 20 weeks in total. We focus on well-known vegetables, and also introduce a few unique ones. Volume and varieties vary with seasons but you may receive...

- Early Spring will be low volume: lettuce, spinach, radishes, spring onions, bok choy, peas, herbs, asparagus, rhubarb
- Late Spring: peas, carrots, summer squash, green beans, lettuce, spinach, radishes, kale, herbs
- Summer: sweet corn, green beans, kohlrabi, carrots, lettuce, tomatoes, onions, cucumbers, peppers, beets, potatoes, cabbage, broccoli, zucchini, herbs
- Late summer: tomatoes, potatoes, carrots, muskmelons, peppers, cabbage, broccoli, green beans, lettuce, sweet corn, onions, watermelons, eggplant, kale, herbs
- Fall: winter squash, potatoes, onions, cabbage, broccoli, carrots, lettuce, peppers, eggplant, kale, spinach, beets, radishes, sweet potatoes.

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All vegetables are hand harvested for the highest quality possible.

The price for the regular season (18 weeks) is \$645 per large family members, \$430 for regular family members or \$215 per single size members.

Pick-up Days and Times

We harvest vegetables every Monday for our CSA participants. The produce is field rinsed (not washed) and stored in the walk-in cooler until you pick it up at the farm on Monday afternoon from 4:00-7:00 PM (unless other arrangements are made). Baskets not claimed during Monday hours will be dispersed on Tuesday after 7 PM unless previous arrangements are made before Monday BY EMAIL. If you have any questions you may contact us at:
